I January

I January 1939 | A French Jew Leon Guterman was born in Paris. On 20 August 1942, he arrived at [#Auschwitz](#) in a transport of 1,000 Jews deported from [#Drancy](#). He was killed in a gas chamber. He was 3 years old.



2 January

2 January 1940 | Polish Jew Alexander Kleinman was born in Będzin. He was deported from the ghetto there to [#Auschwitz](#) in summer of 1942 or 1943. He was killed in a gas chamber at Auschwitz II-Birkenau.



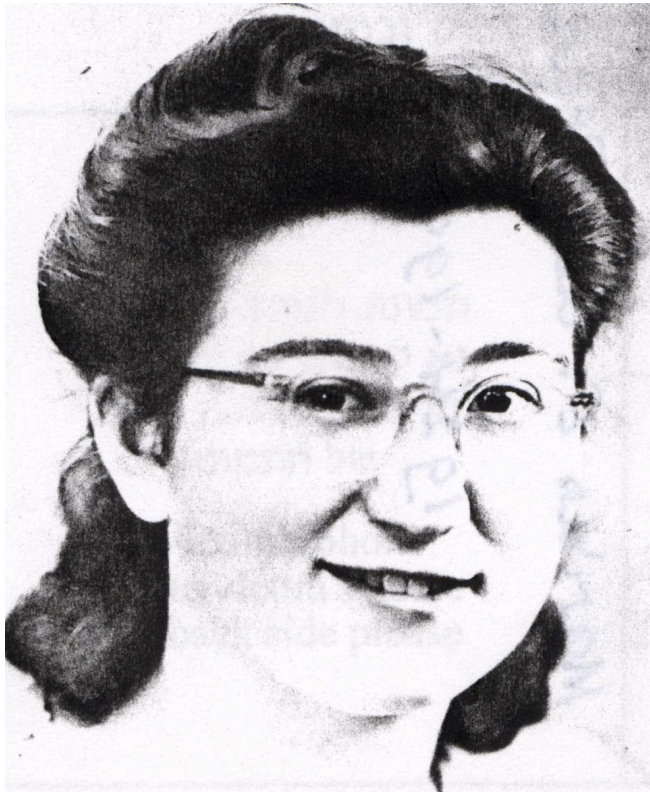
3 January

3 January 1900 | An Italian Jew Emanuele Di Porto was born in Rome. He was a merchant; In 1944 he was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). He did not survive.



4 January

4 January 1925 | A French Jew Jean Salomon Mosse was born in Paris. On 20 November 1943 he was deported from [#Drancy](#) to [#Auschwitz](#) in a transport of 1,200 Jews. He arrived at the camp on 23 November. He did not survive.



5 January

5 January 1924 | A Dutch Jewish girl Elisabeth van Praag was born in Deventer. In October 1942 she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). She did not survive.



6 January

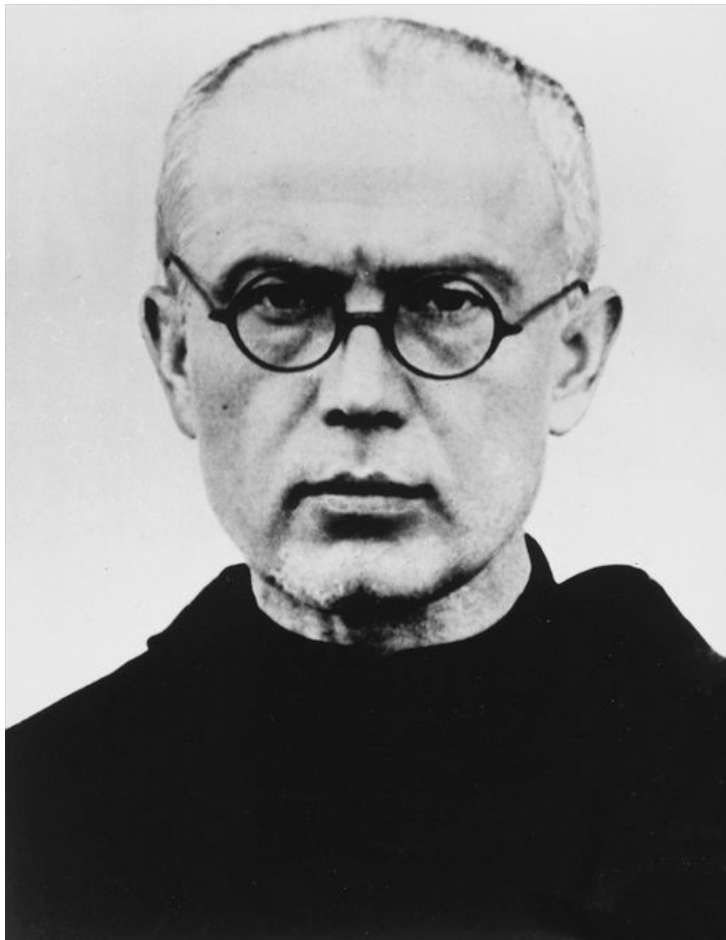
6 January 1945 | Four female Jewish prisoners were hanged at the Lagererweiterung of Auschwitz: Ella Gartner, Róza Robota, Regina Safir & Estera Wajsblum. They were condemned to death for assisting the Sonderkommando in the revolt that broke out on 7 October 1944 in Birkenau.





7 January

7 January 1926 | A Polish Jewish girl Fajgla Kilsztajn was born in Będzin. In 1942 she was deported from the ghetto there to [#Auschwitz](#). She did not survive.



8 January

8 January 1894 | Maximilian Kolbe, was born in Zduńska Wola. As a prisoner of [#Auschwitz](#) on 29 July 1941, he sacrificed his life to save a person selected for starvation death after an escape of a prisoner. On 14 August 1941, he was killed with a phenol injection.



9 January

9 January 1934 | A French Jewish girl Huguette Szterck was born in Paris. On 24 August 1942 she was deported from Drancy to [#Auschwitz](#) in a transport of 1,008 Jews. They arrived at the camp on 26 August. Huguette was murdered in a gas chamber.



10 January

On 10 January in 1941, 26 year old Polish Political prisoner Marian Harapiński no.597 was murdered in [#Auschwitz](#). He was one of many górale (Highlanders) who ended up in the camp. He arrived on the first mass transport on the 14th June 1940.



11 January

11 January 1905 | A Jew Peter Katzenstein was born in Berlin. He was an agriculturist. In autumn of 1943 he was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). He did not survive.





12 January

12 January 1937 | Jewish girl Marianne Kohn was born in Oșorheiu (Marosvásárhely) in Romania. In May 1944 she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). She was murdered in a gas chamber.





13 January

13 January 1875 | German Jewish woman Emma Tobias (nee Oppenheim) was born in Schönlanke (today Trzcianka in Poland). During the war she lived in Berlin. She was deported to [#Auschwitz](#) where she was murdered in a gas chamber.



14 January

14 January 1927 | German Jewish girl Vera Judith Schlein was born in Magdeburg. During the war she lived in Amsterdam. In Jan 1944 deported from Westerbork to Theresienstadt & from there, on 19 October 1944 to [#Auschwitz](#). She was murdered in a gas chamber.



15 January

15 January 1915 | Jewish woman Feiga Tabakman was born in Gdańsk. She was a hatter. In October 1942 she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). She did not survive.



16 January

16 January 1900 | German Jewish woman Edith Frank (née Holländer) was born in Aachen. The mother of Margot & Anne Frank. Incarcerated in [#Auschwitz](#) with her husband Otto & their daughters on 5 Sep 1944. She perished in the camp on 6 January 1945, 10 days before her 45th birthday.



17 January

17 January 1894 | Czech Jewish woman Gertruda Krausová was born. She was deported from Theresienstadt ghetto to [#Auschwitz](#) on 28 October 1944 and murdered in a gas chamber at the age of 50.



18 January

18 January 1925 | Hungarian Jewish woman Vera Weisz was born in Kisvárda. In 1944 she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#). She did not survive.



19 January



19 January 1940 | Hungarian Jewish girl Sarolta Grünwald (in the picture on the left) was born in Csongrad. In June 1944 she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#) and murdered in a gas chamber. She was 4. Her 2-years-older brother Sandor died with her.



20 January



20 January 1877 | Hungarian Jewish woman Hermine Schlesinger was born in Lovas. During the war she lived in Paris. She owned a restaurant. In 1943, she was deported to [#Auschwitz](#) where she was murdered in a gas chamber. She was 66.



21 January

21 January 1930 | Czech Jew
Ervín Vrba was born in Brandlín.

On 5 July 1943 he was
imprisoned in Theresienstadt
ghetto from where on 6 October
1944 he was deported to
[#Auschwitz](#) and murdered in a
gas chamber. He was 14 years old.



22 January

17 January 1933 | French Jewish girl Rosa Lisoprawski was born in Paris. She arrived at [#Auschwitz](#) on 22 January 1944 in a transport of 1,155 Jews from [#Drancy](#). She was murdered in a gas chamber at the age of 11.





23 January

23 January 1943 | Colonel Jan Karcz (no. 23569) approached the camp manager of Auschwitz I Hans Aumeier. He asked to be released to the camp after a six-month sentence at the Penal Company. On the same day, he was imprisoned in a bunker in Block II & two days later he was shot.



24 January



24 January 1942 | Czech Jewish girl Jiřina Steinerová was born in Prague. On 18 May 1944 she was deported from Theresienstadt Ghetto to [#Auschwitz](#) where she was murdered in a gas chamber. She was 2 years old.
