Standalone 2019

Monday 8th July – Friday 12th July

Following another highly successful week in July 2018 we are delighted to be able to offer Standalone Week again in 2019. We believe that Standalone Week is a defining week in our year that sets us apart from other schools and represents our values as outlined in our Way of Being. As such, it is worth all the hard work that staff put into it to make it a success.

Below are the options for the off-Island residential visits on offer for Standalone week 2019.

Once again we have negotiated the best, most competitive quotes from our travel providers. You will notice that we are pleased to have maintained last year's prices for trips this year, the necessary consequence of a realignment of our budget to address the school's teaching and learning priorities. The one week residential visits will cost families £530 whilst the two day Liverpool / Blackpool trip will cost £150. This all-inclusive price covers all travel and accommodation and also the cost of all the advertised activities while away. I assure you that this represents the best possible value for money. Specific details about each visit, provided by each visit leader, are included in information below. Please contact school if you require more information.

Once you have decided which trip you are going to participate in fill in the form provided and return it to the **East Office**. The form should be accompanied with a deposit of £100 placed in a **sealed envelope with student's name, form and destination clearly written on the front**.

It is **important that the reply form and deposit are returned promptly** to guarantee your place on a residential visit, as demand is usually high.

Remember, although enjoyable, Standalone week is all about education. It is an opportunity to learn using the wider world as a classroom. We hope all students will grab this chance to go off island and experience the RGS wider curriculum.

If your son/daughter does not hold their own Manx/English/EU passport they will require a Schengen Visa for any of the visits outside the UK. This is a complicated application that can take a long time to be processed and be quite expensive, depending on the country visited. You should first check with your home Embassy and then the Embassy of the country to be visited.

Y7- Paris

This is a cultural visit to Paris, predominantly for Y7 pupils, during Standalone Week.

We will travel to Paris by executive coach, taking the short tunnel crossing from Dover to Calais.

During the stay pupils will discover several places of interest such as: The Sacré Coeur; Arc de Triomphe~; Champs Elysees~; Notre Dame~; Eiffel Tower~; The Place du Tertre to see the artists display their talent. We will also be spending a day at Parc Asterix, a 125 acre theme park with over 100 attractions, including rides and attractions, live entertainment, animated figures, arts and crafts, reconstructions, a dolphin show, special effects, restaurants and shops. We will also have half a day at "La mer de sable", an amusement park.

Shopping, of course will be on the programme of events too!

Y8 - Amsterdam

We are planning to take students on a visit to Holland during Standalone Curriculum Week.

We hope to stay in Egmond, a beautiful coastal town and take part in a number of group visits and activities in and around Amsterdam. This will include visits to the city where we intend to visit The Van Gogh Museum, The Anne Frank Museum, The Madurodum Model Village, a Canal Cruise around Amsterdam, Madam Tussauds, 16th Century Windmills, a Clog and Cheese making factory and in the evening we intend to go Ten Pin Bowling, visit the beach and go to the Cinema. We will also visit York on the way to Hull and Manchester's Trafford Centre on the return journey, to allow time for shopping.

Y9 - Brussels

Year 9 students have the option of visiting Brussels, Belgium. The city is one of the most beautiful in Europe with impressive architecture, a magnificent cathedral, good shopping and many fascinating museums.

We will travel to Belgium in comfort and style! First of all we will board a Virgin Pendolino train from Liverpool, then take the Eurostar from St. Pancras Station London directly to Brussels.

Whilst in Belgium we endeavour to take part in various educational activities, such as visiting the historic In Flanders Field Museum and Tyn Cot cemetery.

Pupils will have honour of laying a wreath on behalf of RGS at the historic Menin Gate, Ypres. In order to balance history with fun, we will spend a full day at a theme park in the Flemish countryside. It is situated in beautiful landscaped gardens, with several water rides, carousels, rollercoasters and zoo animals. We will also have time to visit a water park, spend time in the heart of Brussels and visit a typical Belgian chocolatier.

On the return journey back to the Isle of Man, (subject to travel arrangements) pupils should also have free time shopping in Liverpool One.

Accommodation will be in a hostel with bed, breakfast and evening meal basis.

Based in a beautiful old listed building in the countryside of SW Wales we are on full board and sleep in dorms. A tuck shop is available for pupils and is open in the evenings. The emphasis is on the outdoors, so when surf conditions do not prevail you may find yourself kayaking, rock climbing amongst other outdoor pursuits. All that we ask is that you have a love of the sea and are adventurous. These activities can be tiring so we ask that you are in good reasonable shape and have the stamina to participate! Places are very limited so it's first come first served!!

And don't forget once you've learnt to surf you can always surf in the Isle of Man (when the wind and swell blow in the right direction!)

Years 7 - 9 London

During Standalone 2019, Year 7 - 9 students have the opportunity of visiting London. This tour takes in all the great sights that the capital has to offer from world famous museums, typical tourist attractions, hopefully a West End Show, as well as the magic of Harry Potter World.

We will travel by Virgin train from Liverpool into the heart of the English capital. Whilst in London, activities may include; visiting the educational greats such as the Natural History Museum; rubbing shoulders with the stars at Madame Tussauds; taking in the view you'll never forget from the London Eye; the gory and gruesome historical events of the London Dungeon; the story of Dewey Finn, an out of work singer and guitarist who pretends to be a substitute teacher in the West End blockbuster School of Rock; a guided walking tour and entry into the magic of Harry Potter World. We may even get a chance to stroll through the shopping areas of Oxford Street and Regent Street.

Accommodation will be in a Central London hotel on a bed, breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal basis. Outward and Inward journey lunches will need to be purchased. Evening meals will be in some of London's famous restaurants including Planet Hollywood, Strada, Pizza Express and TGI Friday's'.
