Standalone 2020

Monday 13th July - Friday 17th July 2020

Following a range of highly successful trips in 2019 we are delighted to be able to offer Standalone Week again in 2020 including a new offer for rugby enthusiasts! We believe that Standalone Week, both on and off Island, is a defining week in our year that sets us apart from other schools and represents our values as outlined in our Way of Being. As such, it is worth all the hard work that staff put into it to make it a success.

Below are the options for the off-Island residential visits on offer for Standalone Week 2020.

Once again we have secured the most competitive quotes from our travel providers. The one week residential visits will cost families no more than £550. The inclusive price covers all travel and accommodation and also the cost of all the advertised activities while away. I assure you that this represents the best possible value for money. (The two day Liverpool / Blackpool trip will cost £150 and two day Sale Sharks trip will cost £175). Specific details about each visit, provided by each visit leader, are included in information below. Please contact school if you require more information.

Once you have decided which trip you are going to participate in, please make payment using one of the following methods:-

- 1. If you have a **ParentPay account all payments from this year can be made via this preferred method,** please log into your account select your chosen trip and pay the deposit of £100.00
- 2. Alternatively fill in the form provided and return it to the East Office. The form should be accompanied with a deposit of £100 placed in a sealed envelope with student's name, form and destination clearly written on the front.

Please act promptly to guarantee your place on a residential visit, as demand is usually high.

Remember, although enjoyable, Standalone week is all about education. It is an opportunity to learn using the wider world as a classroom. We hope all students will grab this chance to go off island and experience the *RGS* wider curriculum.

If your son/daughter does not hold their own Manx/English/EU passport they will require a Schengen Visa for any of the visits outside the UK. This is a complicated application that can take a long time to be processed and be quite expensive, depending on the country visited. You should first check with your home Embassy and then the Embassy of the country to be visited.

Brexit note: Current advice is that on the day you travel, you'll need your passport to have at least 6 months left (and be less than 10 years old even if it has 6 months or more left). The DESC travel insurance policy will cover health or medical issues post Brexit.

Y7- Paris

This is a cultural visit to Paris, predominantly for Y7 pupils, during Standalone Week.

We will travel to Paris by executive coach, taking the short tunnel crossing from Dover to Calais.

During the stay pupils will discover several places of interest such as; The Sacré Coeur, Arc de Triomphe, Champs Elysees, Notre Dame, Eiffel Tower, The Place du Tertre to see the artists display their talent. We will also be spending a day at Parc Asterix, a 125 acre theme park with over 100 attractions, including rides and attractions, live entertainment, animated figures, arts and crafts, reconstructions, a dolphin show, special effects, restaurants and shops. We will also have half a day at "La mer de sable" an amusement park. Shopping, of course will be on the programme of events too!

Y8 – Amsterdam

We are planning to take students on a visit to Holland during Standalone Curriculum Week.

We hope to stay in Amsterdam Zuidoost A/O Hostel and take part in a number of group visits and activities in and around Amsterdam. This will include visits to the city where we intend to visit The Anne Frank Museum, Ajax Stadium, a Canal Cruise around Amsterdam, Madam Tussauds, Rijks Museum and Efteling Theme Park.

Travel will be via Dover to Calais. The cost of the visit includes all transport, all activities mentioned above, half board and accommodation. Students will need money for food on both the Monday and the Friday of the trip while we are in the UK and euros for lunches, sweets, treats and gifts.

Y9 - Brussels

Year 9 students have the option of visiting Brussels, Belgium. The city is one of the most beautiful in Europe with impressive architecture, a magnificent cathedral, good shopping and many fascinating museums. We will travel to Belgium in comfort and style! Firstly, we will take a Virgin Pendolino train from Liverpool, then the Eurostar train from St. Pancras Station London directly into the centre of Brussels.

Whilst in Belgium we endeavour to take part in various activities in order to learn more about World War 1. We will spend a day visiting the historic In Flanders Field Museum and Tyn Cot cemetery. In the evening, we will watch the Last Post ceremony at Menin Gate, Ypres, a tradition held almost continuously since 1928 to remember soldiers who fell in WW1. Two pupils will also have the honour of laying a wreath on behalf of RGS/Isle of Man.

In addition to the cultural and poignant activities above, we will also spend a full day at a theme park. It is situated in beautiful landscaped gardens, with several water rides, carousels,

rollercoasters and zoo animals. We will also have time to spend time in the heart of Brussels to go shopping and visit a typical Belgian chocolatier. Pupils will have the opportunity to sample some delicious Belgian chocolate and have time to make purchases to take home! This year we will also travel to the beautiful city of Bruges, known as the 'Venice of the North'. It is famous for its canals, beautiful buildings and cobbled streets. We will have a canal river cruise and relax with a game of bowling after a day's sightseeing!

On the return journey back to the Isle of Man, (subject to travel arrangements) pupils should also have free time shopping in Liverpool One.

Accommodation will be in a hostel with bed, breakfast and evening meal basis.

All that we ask is that you have a love of the sea and are adventurous. These activities can be tiring so we ask that you are in good reasonable shape and have the stamina to participate! Places are very limited so it's first come first served!!

Inspired by a true story and based on the hit movie, Made in Dagenham is the uplifting British musical comedy about friendship, love and the importance of fighting for what is right and how the women of Ford went out on strike to get equal pay.

Essex 1968. Like millions of other working women, each morning Rita O'Grady is just trying to get her husband out of bed, get the kids off to school and get to work at the factory on time. But life is about to change forever when it's announced that the girls in the stitching room of Ford's Dagenham car plant will have their pay grade dropped to 'unskilled'. Quickly drawing on a strength she never knew she had, Rita leads her friends in a battle against the might of Ford and the corruption of the Union supposed to protect them. We meet Connie who has given her life to the Labour Party, Claire who struggles to get her words out, Beryl who swears like a trooper, Sandra who is the glamourous one of the bunch and Cass who is determined to be an airline pilot by the time she is 35. This is all set to the backdrop of Harold Wilson's England in 1968 when the Labour party were battling with the Unions.

It's a musical that shows us how far we have come for women's equality yet reminds us that the journey isn't over yet! It ends with the heroine a reluctant activist who has put her marriage in jeopardy for her colleagues, addressing the TUC conference and calling for listeners to stand up for women workers. This story has never been more relevant in what is the year of 'The Equality Act' on the Isle of Man.

Funny, touching and timeless, Made in Dagenham shows how ordinary people can do extraordinary things when they stand together. The show has both guts and a sense of humour.

The production encompasses a large cast, from members across all year groups and abilities. It is all inclusive and led by Mrs Will-Jones, Mr Owen, Miss Dunne, as well as Mrs Corrin. This is the premier show of Made in Dagenham on the Isle of Man.
