School Lunches

All students in Years 7 to 10 remain in school at lunchtime, unless they have written permission from parents/carers to go home for lunch. There are three sittings for lunch and each Year Group takes a turn to be on 'first sitting'. The school cafeteria is there to provide students with a nourishing meal with a wide range of healthy foods to choose from in pleasant surroundings. Our cafeteria is cashless, all new students in September will be issued a Smartcard to purchase food at break and lunchtimes, please always ensure Smartcards have credit. This can be done online through ParentPay or by loading cash onto the card at one of the machines in school.

ParentPay

ParentPay is the payment platform which the school uses to help parents pay for their child's lunches and trips. The site allows you to add money to student lunch cards and also track what they are purchasing from the canteen. This means that students are not given the responsibility of bringing cash or cheques into school. You can access the ParentPay site via the school website www.rgs.sch.im or contact the school via RGSenquiries@sch.im. You can log in or create a new account.

If you have any queries about the Smartcards, either before or after you child joins the school, please contact Mr J Kneale, Bursar, on 811100.

Absence and Attendance

Requests to take students out of school during term-time to go on holiday will not be authorised, except in exceptional circumstances. Permission to attend sporting, family or other events should be requested by completing a Leave of Absence form, available from the West Office, so that these can be considered by the Headteacher on an individual basis.

If your child is ill please contact school with the reason and approximately how long they will be absent. You can either email, absence@rgs.sch.im, or telephone 811100 and leave a message on the absence answerphone. This absence should then be followed by **written confirmation** when your child returns to school.

If your child is out of school for part of a day, please complete the absence slip at the back of your child's planner. Students should sign the 'Student Exeat' book at the office on the way out of either building and remember to sign back in when they return to school.

If your child is late for any reason, they should sign the 'Late Book' at the office on the way into school, giving the reason for their lateness.

By Bus

Students who travel to and from school by bus require a Go School Card in order to qualify for a 40p fare. These are available from Bus Vannin or can be purchased and topped up online. Students who receive free school meals also require a card, but these will be issued by the Department of Education, Sport and Culture nearer to the start of term or when a student becomes entitled to free meals.

Cards must be produced on each journey and must be in credit, otherwise students will be charged the normal fare. It is also important to look after the cards as Bus Vannin charge for replacements. Full details are available on their website, along with route information. All of our buses are service buses so for up to date information, visit the government website www.gov.im - Bus and Rail - or contact Ramsey Bus Station – 812151.

By Bicycle

A locked bicycle store with limited space is provided in both the West and East Building and all bicycles brought to school must be stored there during the day. To have an allocated space a student should speak to Mrs Corrin. Riding in any part of the school grounds is not allowed. Parents are reminded that Lezayre Road is a busy and dangerous road - therefore, those cycling to school should have passed a Cycling Proficiency Test and should, in the interests of safety, display fluorescent markers on their bicycles and/or clothing, wear a helmet and have lights fitted for dark nights.

By Car

When driving students to and from school, parents/carers are respectfully asked for everyone's safety: to set down and pick up their children in the lay-by in front of the East Building only, whatever the weather; **not to drive into either of the school driveways at any time during the school day;** never to drop a student at the entrance to the West Building, or in the driveway of that building.

Lockers

A limited number of lockers are available for rental by Years 7 students only. These are a secure place to keep students property, and are £5 for the year. Details are on the form which is sent to parents/carers with all admission information.

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School Uniform

School uniform consists of:

Main School

- White shirt with top button
- School tie (available from Top 2 Toe)
- Black blazer with school badge (available from Top2Toe)
- Plain black trousers/plain skirt (Tight lycra/contour skirts are NOT allowed)
- Plain black sensible, flat heel shoes with no obvious logos
- Tights should be neutral or black coloured

Jewellery

Students may wear – a watch, short necklace and gold/silver ear studs – maximum of two in each ear and nowhere else. No other piercings are allowed.

Only students in Year 11 and the Sixth Form are permitted to wear discreet makeup.

Hair styles: Multi-coloured or extreme hair styles will be challenged

Students are encouraged to wear their uniform with pride.

School Uniform

Please note, only the approved RGS additional kit to be worn in lessons. Any other variations will not be accepted. Every item of clothing must be clearly marked with your child's name.

If your child cannot take part in PE/Games lessons, you should send in a note explaining the reason for your child not taking part. They should still bring their kit to lessons and change as normal – they will be expected to take on a different role within the lesson - scorer, timekeeper, coach, umpire, etc., to enable them to remain involved in the lesson.





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Our Curriculum

Students will study a range of subjects. There are six lessons a day, 30 x 50 minute lessons per week.

House Points

A House Points based reward system is used to award students House Points for good work, exemplary behaviour, representing the school in sporting and/or arts events, as well as "going the extra mile". Students can 'cash in' these points at various times of the year, trading them in for a variety of different rewards

Extra-curricular activities/clubs

We actively encourage students to take part in extra-curricular activities, either during lunchtimes and/or after school. There are so many exciting clubs students can join which can help them to learn new skills, increase confidence and help make new friends. There are a variety of exciting clubs available, something for everyone.

In Year 7, Form Tutors help new students to find the right club and lists of activities can be found in form rooms, on noticeboards and on the school website. Getting involved in clubs and school life is an excellent way to earn House Points too.





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Pastoral Care

Pastoral Structure

We have six balanced tutor groups in each year, and normally students will be in the same tutor group from Y7 to Y11. Year 7 is a 'fixed' year group, in the sense that the Head of Year and the Form Tutors remain with Y7 only. We have a 'through' tutoring system for other years, so when students enter Year 8 they will have a new Form Tutor and Head of Year who will take them through to Y11. The Deputy Head of Year will follow the year group through from Y7 to Y11.

Tutor Groups

In Year 7, each tutor group is based upon forming a diverse mix of students, so that each group has a balanced spread of ability, gender, personalities, sporting attributes and musical interests, and are drawn from different Primary schools. During the transition period there is close consultation with the Primary school class teachers to inform this process. Learning is key to our decision making; a secondary consideration will be social groupings where possible, taking particular account of students who work well together. Friendships readily change when students from different schools meet and these friendships will continue to change as they move through the school. Students are encouraged to meet old friends and to make new ones during social times, and to take a positive approach to their Secondary transition as it is a fresh start for all.

Form Tutor

Form Tutors are amongst the most important teachers in a student's life at Ramsey Grammar School. A Form Tutor is the person students will meet each day at morning and afternoon registrations. They will be able to answer any questions and help students to settle in. Form Tutors get to know students well and will help them to achieve their best and will always be there to help if they have any problems. Each Form Group has the initials of the Form Tutor and a letter as its name, for example, 7ASH. Students will find out what form group they are placed in during our Welcome Days in July. Form tutors are the first point of contact for parents/carers.

Houses

The first letter is the House to which the tutor group belongs. This is used when House Points are awarded and for inter-House activities such as quizzes, Sports Day and the swimming gala. Each House also has its own colour and during the first term students will be given a House t-shirt, which they will be able to wear for House activities.
