

Department Update – Social Sciences

Department Update - Drama

Year 11 Dramatists are currently working very hard in preparation for Unit 2 of the GCSE course – Performing Theatre, where candidates are required to perform an extract from a published script as part of the practical component of the course. Sadly – because of covid-19 restrictions – it isn't possible for the students to perform their scripted pieces in front of a visiting examiner, so instead the performances will be recorded.



Sixth Form Drama students are also preparing for their assessed performance pieces. Year 12 will perform a re-interpretation of an extract from Charlotte Keatley's 'My Mother Said I Never Should'. Ellie Baldwin in Year 13 is required to perform both a scripted piece of drama, as well as an original devised piece for the practical component of the A2 qualification. For her devised piece, Ellie has used the ideas of the Paper Birds Theatre Company, a devised theatre company with a social and political agenda. They are recognised as UK leaders in verbatim theatre. Ellie has reflected these ideas within her piece on immigration, using the voices of interviewees within her piece. With regard to her scripted piece, Ellie has adapted the epistolary book '84 Charing Cross Road' by Helene Hanff, a true story about the 20 year correspondence between the author and Frank Doel – an antiquarian book seller located at the eponymous address in London.
