Planetary Alignment 2022: How To Watch This Rare 1000-Year Space Event?

Earth and Space topics are currently being taught across Y7 and Y13. We are encouraging students to 'reach for the planets' and look at the brightest planets in May's night sky: How and when to see them? Jupiter will climb higher each morning, reaching much fainter <u>Mars</u> by the 29th. Meanwhile, Mars provides an opportunity to make a sighting (with good binoculars and telescopes) of the most distant planet — <u>Neptune</u> — on the 18th, with Mars passing just to the south of this bluish gas giant. <u>Saturn</u> is also a morning object, positioned far to the west of Venus, Jupiter and Mars.








Department Update – DT & IT
