### **Department Update - RMPS**

In RMPS we are always keeping our fingers on the pulse to make sure students have the opportunity to examine and discuss current and relevant topics in lessons. Over the past few weeks students in Y9-12 have asked questions about and taken part in discussions about recent news stories regarding the proposed introduction of assisted dying on our very island and the abortion debate in reference to the current situation in America with the US Supreme Court ruling. Some of our Y9 students have been debating whether whole life sentences or the death penalty is a more severe punishment for criminals. And of course we have discussed the ongoing war in Ukraine, with reference to refugees, the just war theory and pacifism. These topics and the religious and secular views people have on them have links to our GCSE and A Level course but we primarily cover things like this because we feel it is essential for young people to have an objective environment in which to explore things going on right now that might affect their lives and shape the world they will inherit as they enter into adulthood.

### **Year 10 Global Perspectives**

Mrs Davies & Miss Brown's Global Perspective classes are busy working hard on their Team Projects. The students have devised their own aim & outcome. Examples include 'Raising awareness of Ukrainian Refugees' and 'Racism & Discrimination'. They are being creative with their display boards, Instagram pages, documentaries and play motion clips. They have also been researching different cultural perspectives on their topic areas and have devised questionnaires and sent them to Manx residents and a Malaysian school. We are holding a 'Global Perspectives Showcase' on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> June where they students will present their findings on their aim.
