
RGS Newsletter Friday 9th September 2022 – Issue 1

It has been a busy and positive start to the new academic year, as we once again welcome in a new cohort of Year 7 students into the RGS community, as well as new and returning students to every year across the school.

In other news, we will be building our House systems up this year and we are planning to increase the focus and number of events put on to celebrate our Houses. We now have a senior member of staff responsible for the House system and events linked to it, which has not been the case in the past. Our Houses are such an important part of Ramsey Grammar School history and culture, both for current staff and students, and our alumni far and wide. For those new to the school our House names are; Ayre, Barrule, Cushag, Vollan, Raven and Snaefell, and all stem from places or items of Manx cultural significance. Watch this space for more news.

You will notice that we have changed the naming of our tutor groups this year with each group named using a numerical system rather than a House as their name now. (For instance 10.2 instead of 10 Barrule). Tutor groups may now have a mix of students from every House; Ayre, Barrule, Cushag, Vollan, Raven and Snaefell, instead of only having students from one House per tutor group. This will allow us to provide even more opportunities to build relationships and widen their social interactions within their tutor groups, across different tutor groups, and indeed across the entire school community. It will give students an opportunity to mix as a house as well as across the houses across their lessons and the house events. This has also enabled us to lower numbers in tutor groups in some year groups allowing Tutors to dedicate more time to each student. It will also mean that lessons taught within tutor groups will be lower in numbers in many cases.

You may have seen elsewhere, but I wanted to let all families know that there has been a Government change to term dates in December, and the Christmas term will now finish for all schools across the island on Thursday 22nd December and not as previously advertised on Friday 23rd December.



Obviously, with the sad news of the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II yesterday evening, we have been opening up discussions with students across the school on her life and legacy, and what comes next. Our flags fly at half-mast as a mark of respect and thanks during this period of mourning. All RGS social media accounts will remain silent during this time.

We began this year as we always do, with the school photographer in and wanted to let all Parents/ Carers know that there is a second session to cover Sixth Form students, and any students who were absent this week on Wednesday 21st September in the West Hall.

Some of our well established extra curricular clubs will be starting next week, and all other clubs the week after. As we always do, we have a huge number of exciting options on offer for student to take part in. REMINDER: RGS Lanyard System - Sept 2023

From the start of the new school year this September, all students, staff, and visitors at RGS have been required to wear an RGS lanyard as a compulsory part of the uniform. The wearing of lanyards for all adult and children on site will allow us to ensure that we keep our staff and students safe at all times and ensure that everyone on the school site is approved and visitors are logged in and out at reception appropriatly each day.

Each Year group has a different colour, which will change each year as they move up through the school. Students will be issued with a complimentary lanyard at the start of each school year, enabling everyone to make a fresh start every September as they begin in a new Year group. As with our current Smartcard system, any that are lost through the course of the year can be replaced at West Reception via the Student Window for a small fee.

The lanyards all have a safety break clip and house the RGS Smartcard used to pay for lunches. These have been embraced by students and staff so far, and we appreciate all continued support from home to ensure that our young people continue to wear them as standard each day.
