

Natasha's Law & RGS Catering Department

Natasha's Law.

What is Natasha's Law?

This is a new set of rules, known as Natasha's Law, which was introduced in the UK from October 2021. It requires all food businesses to include full ingredients labelling on pre-packaged foods, i.e., Sandwiches, Salads, Baguettes, Wraps.

It was brought in after the tragic and avoidable death of Natasha Ednan-Laperouse who died after suffering an allergic reaction after purchasing a baguette from Pret a Manger which contained sesame seeds.

This law is not currently in force in the Isle of Man, however, Ramsey Grammar School Catering Department have invested in a Date Genie Labelling machine to ensure all pre-packaged items are correctly labelled with all ingredients to allow your children to read exactly what ingredients are in a food item so they can decide if it is safe for them to eat if they suffer from allergies.

RGS UCAS Update

The final RGS deadline for this year's university applications is today. The 6th form team have seen improved offers from universities when applications are made early. This also helps to focus the mindset of our students, as they prepare for their mock exams in January, as they have a clear goal to be working for.

Already this year there have been some really successful offers for students who sent their applications in early.

- Two students have been invited for interview by University of Cambridge (Maths / History & Politics)
- Rachel Callow is applying for Primary Education, she has been asked for interview by four institutions in one week and received offers from all of them once the interviews were completed.
- Both Conan Dykes and Althea Mallorca applied and have received offers for courses in Physiotherapy. These are very tricky courses to get on and they have they have undergone some gruelling interviews!
- Abi Davidson has applied for Optometry. These courses are incredibly oversubscribed, but she has already received offers from the Universities of Cardiff, Manchester, and Ulster.
- Tom Willis has already received offers from four of his universities to study Law. (Chester, Edge Hill, Lancaster, Liverpool)

Every year our Year 12 students link with Junior Achievement on the COMPANY PROGRAM. They work in teams to set up and run their company over the course of one academic year. They elect a Board of Directors from amongst their peers, raise share capital, develop, market and finance a product or service of their choice.

At the end of the year they present a report and accounts to their shareholders. Students gain experience of the real world, taking responsibility and being accountable to their shareholders for the running of the business.

This year RGS has 6 teams entered and at the moment, they are getting their first pitch ready for presentation on the 11 January 2023.

They will then continue working on their company and will compete in the finals on the 14 and 15 March 2023 at the Palace hotel. Companies from all secondary schools will be competing against each other. There are numerous awards which they will be hoping to win, which are listed below:

Department Update- Music



Music home learning update!

In order to support home learning, the Music department has subscribed once again to *Focus on Sound* – an amazing online resource containing lessons, listening tests, study pieces, and composing tasks. It is an ideal resource for supporting and assessing the work we cover in class, and at GCSE level it has really proved vital in helping students to prepare for their final listening exam. It can also be used to support students who are working towards ABRSM theory grades, or those who simply want to improve their understanding of an area within the subject.



In the new year we will be uploading a variety of short topic-related listening exercises for all Key Stage 3 students (with house points as rewards for work completed in a timely fashion!) and will regularly be setting listening tasks for exam classes using *Focus on Sound* from January onwards.

Students will access *Focus on Sound* via their RGS Teams address, and to this end, parental permission is required in order to add them to the online registers. You can give consent for your child to use *Focus on Sound* via the Parent app. Select the 'Data Collection' section for your child, then open the 'Parental Consent' option and scroll down until you find *Focus on Sound* on the menu and check the box!



Department Update - Drama



A busy term in the Drama department!

Year 7 students have been studying all things Manx, dramatising Manx disasters such as the Snaefell Mining Disaster and the sinking of the Ellan Vannin, as well as looking at the Gaiety Theatre and the Manx film industry.

Year 8 are currently reading the adaptation of Michael Morgurgo's 'Private Peaceful', having previously studied the History of Theatre. Meanwhile Year 9 have investigated the two major drama practitioners Stanislavski and Brecht and are now developing some original devised drama pieces based on different stimuli.

At Key Stage Four Year 10 are experimenting with a variety of devising techniques and they have started studying their set text: 'Face' by Benjamin Zephaniah. Year 11 students have successfully completed their devised piece (worth 40% of their GCSE) and are now preparing for their forthcoming mock examination.

AS level Drama and Theatre students are re-interpreting Jim Cartwright's 'Two', as well as studying the set text 'A View from the Bridge' by Arthur Miller. Their A2 counterparts are being kept very busy studying two set texts ('The Radicalisation of Bradley Manning' by Tim Price and 'A Day in the Death of Joe Egg' by Peter Nichols), as well as being in rehearsal for their scripted and devised pieces.

Mrs Dunne and I are proud of the way our students enthusiastically embrace the learning opportunities available to them within the Drama Studios. Recently, The Guardian newspaper stated that:

'Drama enables children to explore issues of global concern, to develop new perspectives and acquire essential skills. Drama is a social art form that is informed by the interests of the participants. It is a collaborative learning experience... it has been evident for many years that youngsters thrive in schools where drama is accessible to all.'

Fortunately, Ramsey Grammar School **is** a school where drama is accessible to all and where our students thrive!





Department Update - Social Science



Year 10 Business Studies have been learning about motivational theories this week in their Business Studies lessons. In their lesson they prepared pick n mix bags - Taylor's theory on 'piece rate' and also 'division of labour' was the aim of the lesson and they had lots of fun putting their knowledge into action.

Year 10 Global Perspectives students have been working since September on developing their teamwork, collaboration and research skills. They have been working in teams to 'promote awareness of knife crime in the UK' and have produced high quality posters outlining the causes & consequences of knife crime in the UK, all of which were fully referenced. They have also been practicing writing reflective papers on their experience of working in a team - very interesting reading!!

Well done to all our Year 10 Social Science students - a great start to your GCSE's.





Department Update - D&T



The rush is on this week to finish projects. Year 7 and 8 are moving to their next modules and Year 9 only have one more week with their current teachers.

Product Design students are studying the 'Memphis Group' – these were an Italian design and architecture group founded by Ettore Sottsass in the 1980's. Their style was inspired by Art Deco and Pop Art. Memphis were well known for their use of bright colours, geometric shapes and bold patterns. Students are having great fun designing their own furniture, creating 3D drawings and making their finished designs out of a mixture of brightly coloured materials.



Year 10 **Product Design** and working on CAD/CAM. Computer Aided Design and Manufacture. They are using specialised software to design and model gaming controls.



Textile Technology – year 8 students are working on hat designs. Following patterns, the students are then cutting out, hand sewing decorations and machine stitching to finish the product. Very handy now the weather is turning cold!
