Before you start your 1<sup>st</sup> Year application you will need the following

**The details of any address were you have resided in the past 4 years**

This is to evidence that you meet the residency criteria set out in the Student Awards regulations.

**Your email address. This must be the Student's personal email not a shared one.**

This is how the Student Awards team will contact you during your studies. If you get a new email address please contact the Student Awards team as soon as possible. Otherwise you may not receive important updates from the Student Awards team.

**Your first choice University and Course details**

Don't worry if this changes later on, you can contact the Student Awards team who will update your application.

**Your Bank details**

If you are applying for a Maintenance Grant we will need Bank details to pay this. If these details change please contact the Student Awards team as soon as possible. It can take up to 7 working days to make the change.

**To complete your application you will need to provide the following**

**Your Unconditional Offer from the university**

A screenshot of UCAS Track will do, otherwise the official offer letter you will receive from the university.

**You're A-Level results**

You will need a minimum of 80 UCAS points to be eligible for a Student Award. This is equivalent to C/D/D, but it's best to aim higher.

**Your Contributors will need to complete an Income Assessment**

Even if you have not applied for a means-tested award, your parents will need to create an account to sign the Student Awards declaration. Any questions about this can be answered by the Student Awards Team.

## What the Student Awards team may accept as evidence/proof

When you make an application for funding from the Isle of Man Student Awards team, we may ask you to provide proof during some parts of the application. Below is a list of what the Team may accept.

### For Proof of Age the department will accept the following proof

- Current passport or time expired passports where the photograph is still recognisable
- Driving licence
- EU identity card
- Isle of Man Proof of Age Card

### For Bank details the department will accept the following proof

- A bank statement that shows your full name and banking details
- A screenshot of your Online banking that shows your full name and banking details

### For Unconditional offer the department will accept the following proof

- A letter from your University showing a clear Unconditional offer
- A screenshot of your Online UCAS Track Unconditional offer details

### For Exam results the department will accept the following proof

- A copy of your Candidate Statement of Results
- Copies/Photos of your Exam certificates
- Proof of your continuing studies (for Continuing students only)
- Proof of receiving 120 credits (for Continuing students only)
- Proof of your 2.1 or above results (for Post Graduate students only)

### For Student Income the department will accept the following proof

- Proof of any Scholarship or Sponsorship
- Proof of any Trust Income
- Proof of any pension payments
- Proof of any other Unearned Income

**This list is not extensive and there may be other papers/documents/proof that the Student Awards team may accept**

# Not got the grades you were expecting?

## 2024-25 Academic Year

### First Degrees

The academic criteria for support a first degree is 80 UCAS points.

If you have not met the academic criteria laid out in the Education (Student Awards) Regulations 2019 your application for support will be **refused**. However, should you decide to self-fund the first year of your course and successfully pass year 1, the Department may consider support from year 2 onwards, under the Regulations in force at that time. You must also have met the 4 year residency criteria at the start of your course.

Please note that the Tuition loan is not available when self-funding an academic year.

### Foundation Years

An application for support for a foundation year will be **refused**. This is because a foundation year is the same academic level as A-levels or a level 3 qualification. However, should you decide to self-fund a foundation year and successfully pass, the Department may consider support from year 1 onwards, under the Regulations in force at that time. You must also have met the 4 year residency criteria at the start of your course.

Please note that the Tuition loan is not available when self-funding a foundation year.

### Alternative Courses

The academic criteria for support an alternative course is listed below:-

- Foundation degree – 32 UCAS points
- HND or comparable course - 32 UCAS points
