# Year 10



**‘Steam Punk Box’** mixed media project based on the work of Finnabair. The students will start their Art GCSE course through focusing on how to build a vibrant, personal sketchbook, through research, exploration and experimentation. The students will go on to design and create their own decorative wooden box, using found objects, in the style of the Polish artist Finnabair.

**‘Abstract Macro Urban Pot’** ceramic project. In this project the students will develop their 3D skills further through the media of clay. Continuing from their previous project and finding the beauty in objects that are used, weathered, worn and discarded, the students will design and build their own ceramic pot. Here the students will look at texture, shape and colour to help generate their ideas and designs. Learning to use the slab technique to build their pots, the students will create their surfaces using a range of moulding, carving, impressing and stamping. The students will learn how to distress their surfaces to create an aged and worn effect.







# Year 11

**'Self-Portrait'** in this project the students will learn how to capture the human face. With a technical start the students will learn how to map out the face through line and then how to add form through tone. The students will create studies of themselves, practising their newly learnt techniques before going on to research and select a portrait artist of their choice. Here the students will diversify, as they develop their self portraits, on A1 canvas, in the style of their selected artists.

**'Art and Design GCSE Externally Set Assignment'** the students will complete their Art and Design GCSE course through the preparation and completion of a ten-hour practical exam. The exam carries 40% of the students' overall mark.
